How Texas oilman John Havens went from wells to wellness.



A geologist by training, John Havens is the president of Seismic Exchange, a Houston-based company that provides seismic data to the oil and gas industry. While he remains devoted to his vocation--he's worked 31 years with the company, which was founded by his father--he revamped his life when he followed his avocation and bought Cal-a-Vie, a luxury spa outside San Diego, with his wife, Terri. The purchase, completed in 2000, grew out of his interest in fitness; he's a former marathoner and an avid jogger. The father of three children (ages 7, 8, and 12--"we had a three-run homer in the bottom of the ninth," he says of becoming a parent in his 40s), he makes time for traveling, collecting antiques, and restoring historic homes, and is a benefactor of Texas Children's Hospital. He's currently erecting a French chapel on his Houston property and recently repaved his driveway with 20,000 square feet of cobblestones from Lyon, purchased from Ruth Gay's architectural salvage shop, Chateau Domingue, in Houston.
